

## H2 – The Nuts and Bolts

Four centuries after Henry Cavendish identified the element hydrogen, it is finally taking the centre stage. Just in time too, it would seem, considering the times we live in.

In August 2021, Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced India’s goal to become a green hydrogen hub—an initiative aimed at enabling a quantum leap in the country’s transition to clean energy. Just six months later, in January 2022, the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE) and the International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA) signed an agreement to advance “cost-effective decarbonisation” through the development of domestic green hydrogen. In February, the Ministry of Power notified the Green Hydrogen policy.

While we see the potential for green hydrogen to achieve these goals, where exactly are we and where do we go from here?
